

# New Behaviour Policy

Having listened to the views of community, we are excited to introduce our new *Relationships and Behaviour Policy*. It is important to stress that this policy is about forming positive relationships at all times and working to create a triangle of success with our children, our staff and our parents/carers so that our children get the very best so they can thrive. It really is simple: Be Ready - Be Responsible - Be Respectful. These three rules form our code of conduct and they clearly link to our core values of Aspire – Believe – Achieve.

The new policy was introduced to staff during INSET on Monday and to the children throughout this week both in class and in assembly. The absolute key to success is **consistency** but personalisation is important so there are elements which are personalised to each class based on staff experience and expertise and the cohort. ## Healthy Eating reminders

#### **Healthy Snack Policy**

 Our school policy is that we encourage all children to have fresh fruit or vegetables at morning break time. Sweets, crisps, cheese strings, chocolate, crackers and items such as Fruit Winders are not permitted. KS1 and EYFS pupils are provided with a snack but KS2 pupils can bring a healthy fruit or vegetable snack to eat at morning break.

#### **Birthday Treats**

 Children are asked not to bring sweets / treats / cakes in to celebrate their birthdays as this leads to peer pressure, does not support our healthy school status and is challenging for pupils with allergies etc. We brought this into effect following our Poverty Proofing audit in 2019, results of which can be found here. Thank you for your support.

#### **Packed Lunch Policy**

- Parents and pupils are encouraged to send a healthy packed lunch. No fizzy drinks are permitted.
- Packed lunches should not contain any products containing nuts (peanut butter, Nutella / nut-based chocolate spreads, nut based cereal bars etc.) as we have a number of children in school with a severe nut allergy.

#### Dolce - school dinners

Prior to the Summer holidays we forwarded a letter from Dolce/School Grid to all existing families regarding the changes they were making to their payment system with effect from the new school year. However, it has caused some confusion so we have gained clarification from Dolce regarding their new system.

- Dolce/School Grid will now work in line with the high school lunch accounts process, in that money needs to be loaded onto the child's account <u>prior</u> to the meal being taken and payment is deducted from the account following each meal.
- You are able to top up the account with any amount so that you don't have to do this on a daily basis.
- Dolce will no longer allow debt to be incurred due to the large amounts of debtors they have to follow up each year.
- Dolce have stated that if a child's account is in debt by two
  meals they will be unable to provide further meals until the
  account is in credit.
