

We do try our best and I appreciate that errors can be frustrating, however, if you have missed a message, please be patient and understanding as we always try to rectify errors! - Office team Ms Hedayti is responsible for general school admin, admissions, school meals and general enquiries and Mrs Steele is responsible for attendance. Mrs. Topping is the school business manager and should be contacted with any questions related to finance including bookings for Sunrise and Sunset Cub. The office is open 8.30am 3.45pm so you will come into contact with all three members of the office team as they work different hours.
- Teaching staff can be contacted via email but please remember it is not a 24 hour service! All staff check their emails daily and emails will not be answered after 5pm so please do not email expecting an urgent response. Their email addresses are

- Messages are sent via School Spider so it is essential that we always have your current email address. We do not generally use the messaging system linked to class dojo as the main aim of class story is promoting positive behaviour rather than providing a direct messaging service.

- Website <u>www.cheadleheathprimary.com</u> Our school website is a great source of information and is regularly updated about school and school events. Each class also has their own page so keep checking for updates.
- Newsletters This newsletter is sent via email approx. every two weeks. It is also available on the school website here. Please ensure your email address is always up to date as the information in the newsletter is important. If you do not receive your newsletter by email, you can always ask for a hard copy to be distributed or collect one from the office. We ask that you check Head Lines newsletter before phoning the school office with queries.

Please talk to us!

I am keen that as a school we are open and approachable. We understand that sometimes parents / carers may be frustrated about issues that arise and we will always do our best to solve these. Equally, we would much prefer parents / carers to contact us directly with concerns rather than raise them on social media before we have had the chance to respond.

We understand that fixed 'teacher liaisons' rarely fall at the time you want to speak to the teachers concerned. So, if you want to speak to a teacher about something that won't take much time,

please liaise with them at the end of the school day when you pick your child up. Clearly you may need to wait until all the other children have been picked up from their class, but this will allow for a more spontaneous dialogue to occur on an 'as and when' basis. Obviously, if you need to discuss something at length then please arrange a time for a phone call or face to face meeting.

Y6 Moving On; but not just yet

The closing date for secondary school applications is 31st October 2023. The form is live now and can be submitted at anytime up to 31st October through this online link. You can apply for up to six schools and it is not guaranteed that your child will get a place at your preferred school if you only name one.

Attendance Matters

It's the start of the term and we love it when you're in school! Regular attendance is the most important thing that can help your child with their learning and to develop strong friendships. Parents are responsible for getting their children to school every day on time but as a school we have a duty to ensure good attendance and we regularly monitor individual pupils. Our school attendance target is 97%. We expect children to achieve or better this figure. Good attendance at school is essential so we will not authorise ANY absence unless it is truly exceptional. If your child isn't here, he/she can't learn. Where attendance becomes a cause for concern, the school policy is followed.

- Illness: If your child is ill, it is your responsibility to contact the office on the first day of absence to let us know the reason.
- Emergency Medical Appointments: Routine appointments should be made after school hours or in the holidays. Please inform the office if your child has an emergency appointment.
- Observance of a religious festival: Please inform school if your child is off school due to a religious festival.
- Holidays should be taken during the 13 weeks of school holidays over the year. Term time holidays will not be authorised and may lead to you being issued a Fixed Penalty Notice. Term dates, holidays and INSET days can be found on the school website calendar as well as at the back of this newsletter. Please ensure that you and all other family members refer to this when booking holidays, as absences for holidays are unauthorised.

If your child needs to be absent from school due to exceptional circumstances, please complete the Leave of Absence form which can be obtained from the school office. We request that you do not email with a request as we need a hard copy for our audit trail. If you have any questions or concerns regarding your child's attendance, please contact school.
