












### What a busy week we've had!

Mrs Murphy launched Anti Bullying week with a thought proving assembly using the theme *make a noise about bullying*. We have used the beautiful, wordless picture book 'I Walk with Vanessa' as a whole school text to deliver key messages and have reinforced the roles involved in bullying using the words bystander, perpetrator, target, ringleader, reinforcer, assistant and defender/upstander. Some wonderfully powerful work has been produced throughout school including the most stunning dance performed by LKS2 where they immersed themselves in the story. It was so powerful that when our catering team watched, they had goosebumps and spontaneously gave them a round of applause.

Y6 visited Cheadle Mosque and had an amazing time. Visits to sacred spaces bring the agreed RE syllabus to life and underpins the role of RE in helping pupils prepare for life in today's diverse world. The experience of visiting Cheadle Mosque was aimed to help the pupils learn more about the Islamic faith and support work completed in class. They took part in various workshops and had a guided tour looking at the key features of Cheadle Mosque to see how it features in the Islamic faith and talked about the significance of the design and the important role it plays in the community. They learnt about the Kabba and the pilgrimage to Mecca and those who wanted to dressed in traditional Islamic wear reflecting how those who arrive at Mecca dress. Everyone learnt about charity how wrote their name in Arabic. Year 6 really enjoyed the whole experience and have since written some fantastic reflections. The best comment was, "This has been the best trip I've ever been on, it really highlighted the similarities between my Christian faith and Islam. I loved it!"

#### PE Kits

To ensure consistency with PE kits / footwear in school, please read the following:

- The Stockport policy is that no footwear for dance and gym, as is the national advice. The Association for PE guidance states: In gymnastics and dance, barefoot work is safest, whether on the floor or apparatus, because the toes can grip. Barefoot work both in gymnastics and dance can improve aesthetics by allowing the foot and toes to move through a full range of flexion and extension, which in turn strengthens the muscles, bones and joints. However, pumps or trainers should be worn indoors for games activities such as dodgeball and for outdoor PE too.
- If your child has a verruca, the medical advice is that veruccas don't need covering. However, if they are really painful they can be dressed appropriately with plasters/padding that aren't going to come off in the lesson as long as they don't cause a slipping hazard. Parents can't withdraw their child from the PE curriculum. Without a doctor's note, all pupils should participate barefoot as per school and LA policy.

#### Outdoor area development

We are excited to reveal the final design for our new outdoor area - phase 1 of our grounds development - which is scheduled to be installed over the Easter holidays 2024. We have a significant amount of money to raise before the installation so if you have any fundraising ideas do let me know! #### Allergy Aware

Packed lunches should not contain any products containing nuts (peanut butter, Nutella or similar nut-based chocolate spreads, nut based cereal bars etc.) as we have children in school who have severe nut allergies. If your child has eaten breakfast containing nuts, please ensure that they wash their face and hands before school.

### Q - My child isn't allergic to nuts, why can't they bring in nuts?

A -There are people in school with nut allergies, reactions can occur if they inhale allergen particles in the air, or if they come into contact with a contaminated item for example, drinking from someone else's cup.

#### Q - What happens if someone has an allergic reaction?

A - The symptoms of a food allergy may include a rash anywhere on the body, or a tingling or itchy feeling in the mouth, sickness and feeling lethargic. More serious symptoms may include: Swelling in the face, throat and/or mouth, difficulty breathing, severe asthma, abdominal pain, nausea and vomiting. In extreme cases there could be a dramatic fall in blood pressure (anaphylactic shock). The person may become weak and floppy which may lead to collapse and unconsciousness. On rare occasions, this can be fatal.

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#### Stay & Learn Maths with Me

Next week we are holding 'Stay & Learn Maths with Me' for Y1 - Y6 parents. This is a chance for you to come into class and join in with our daily maths lesson. We ask that you do not bring any preschool children to the event and that you limit numbers to one adult per child, per day.
