












Half way through the year!

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
World Book Day 2024

This opens a vulnerability window that will never close, as the internet is plagued with individuals who will seek to do harm to the media poster in question. Whether for financial gain or just because they feel like it, online spectators can easily find out key details about an individual's life. Their place of work, their home address and their identity. But what happens, when these malicious spectators decide to publish this information publicly rather than harvesting it for themselves?
