












Sporting Success

RESPECT Charter Reminder

In the autumn term Stockport Local Authority launched the 'RESPECT' charter which I informed parents about in newsletter issue #5 (19.10.18) and issue #6 (31.10.18). Copies were distributed to parents via email but, as it is the the start of a new year, I feel that it is timely to remind parents of the charter, which is on prominent display around school

The rationale behind the policy is that as a school (and council), we believe staff, parents and children are entitled to a safe and protective environment in which to learn and work and that all members of the school community and visitors should demonstrate mutual respect. The Respect Charter works alongside the Respect Policy, a policy which highlights our expectations for adult members of the school community. A respectful approach is something we believe is fundamental to a safe and protective environment for your children, and - as adult role models - we need to demonstrate this same quality of respect ourselves.

The Charter and Policy were developed for schools throughout Stockport by a number of organisations working in partnership, as indicated by the different logos at the top of the documents. Please take time to read the Charter and Policy as, in doing so, it will enable us to work positively in partnership together to ensure that Cheadle Heath Primary continues to be a safe place for everyone to learn and work. Cheadle Heath Voice Launch

Before Christmas I advised parents that, as only four volunteers came forward, the Parent Council would not be relaunched this academic year.
